RESOLUTION NUMBER 2009-01

**INCREASED FUNDING FOR SECTION 166
OF THE WORKFORCE INVESTMENT ACT OF 1998**

We, the Indian and Native American Grantees of the National Indian and Native American Employment and Training Conference (NINAETC) attending the 30th Annual Conference in Sacramento, California, in order to preserve and perpetuate for ourselves and our descendants rights secured under Indian Treaties and benefits to which we are entitled under the laws and constitution of the United States and the several states, to enlighten the public toward a better understanding of the Native people, to preserve and perpetuate Indian and Native cultural values, and otherwise promote the welfare of the Indian and Native people, do hereby establish and submit the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the NINAETC are the representatives of and advocates for national, regional, and tribal concerns; and

WHEREAS, the NINAETC is a national organization comprised of American Indians, Alaska Natives, and Native Hawaiians; and

WHEREAS, the health, safety, welfare, education, economic and employment opportunity and preservation of cultural and natural resources are primary goals and objectives of NINAETC; and

WHEREAS, the Indian and Native American Grantees have been underfunded by the Department of Labor since the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act; and

WHEREAS, the Indian and Native American Grantees have been historically funded at a level less than required in the Workforce Investment Act of 1998;

WHEREAS, we, the Indian and Native American Grantees hereby respectfully request the Secretary of Labor and the United States Congress, to increase funding for Section 166, Indian and Native American Grantee Programs to \$75 million;



**COLLECTION OF DATA NOT REQUIRED BY SECTION 166
OF THE WORKFORCE INVESTMENT ACT OF 1998**

We, the Indian and Native American Grantees of the National Indian and Native American Employment and Training Conference (NINAETC) attending the 30th Annual Conference in Sacramento, California, in order to preserve and perpetuate for ourselves and our descendants rights secured under Indian Treaties and benefits to which we are entitled under the laws and constitution of the United States and the several states, to enlighten the public toward a better understanding of the Native people, to preserve and perpetuate Indian and Native cultural values, and otherwise promote the welfare of the Indian and Native people, do hereby establish and submit the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the NINAETC are the representatives of and advocates for national, regional, and tribal concerns; and

WHEREAS, the NINAETC is a national organization comprised of American Indians, Alaska Natives, and Native Hawaiians; and

WHEREAS, the health, safety, welfare, education, economic and employment opportunity and preservation of cultural and natural resources are primary goals and objectives of NINAETC; and

WHEREAS, the Indian and Native American Grantees are required to submit information which is not required by law; and

WHEREAS, the Indian and Native American Grantees have a legal obligation to protect the privacy of all participants; and


WHEREAS, the Indian and Native American Grantees are committed to comply with all laws of the land; particularly to meet all legal requirements for provisions of Section 166, of the Workforce Investment Act of 1998;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the 30th National Indian and Native American Employment and Training Conference strongly encourage the Native American Employment and Training Council to develop a "White Paper" to the Secretary of Labor requesting that all reporting instruments be in compliance with all applicable federal laws and that information not specifically required by said laws be eliminated from Section 166 reporting.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that should the Secretary of Labor choose to impose additional reporting requirements on Indian and Native American Grantees that the Secretary provide non-Section 166 funding necessary to implement this additional data collection.

WHEREAS, resources that are available for training and technical assistance to Indian and Native American Grantees is limited to the 1% of funds available to Section 166 Indian and Native American Grantees for Comprehensive Service Plans;


WHEREAS, the Indian and Native American Grantee community has no involvement in the decision making process for the expenditures made from these funds;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the 30th National Indian and Native American Employment and Training Conference strongly encourage the Native American Employment and Training Council to develop a "White Paper" to the Secretary of Labor requesting the "1% funds" be utilized for purposes specified by the Indian and Native American Grantees;


